

Ikaho Onsen

One of the features of this onsen resort is the stone steps at the center of the onsen resort. Here you can enjoy two types of onsen. : "Kogane no Yu (Golden water)" , in which the iron contained turns the spring in brownish-red color, and "Shirogane no Yu (Silver water)" , whose gushing was discovered in recent years.



Haruna-jinja Shrine

This is an old shrine with a history of more than 1400 years, located in the middle of Mt. Harunasan. The deity is enshrined in the Misugataiwa cave behind the shrine chamber. This shrine has come to be known as a major power spot in the Kanto area, thought to be flowing with mystical energy.

Takasaki Daruma

Buddhist priests at the Shorinzan Darumaji Temple in Takasaki City began making these dolls. The dolls' eyebrows represent cranes, while their whiskers represent turtles. The production of Takasaki Daruma is the largest among Daruma in Japan.
